« Empowering young people and adolescents in relation to SRHR »

Improving access to sexual and reproductive health rights for Ivorian youth and adolescents

In Ivory Coast, where the median age is 19, young people's access to sexual and reproductive health services is limited. This particularly affects young girls who are exposed to early and/or unwanted pregnancies (fertility rate of 124% for 15-19 year olds and 193% for 20-24 year olds), an over-representation of maternal mortality and morbidity, as well as gender-based violence (including female genital mutilation which affects more than a third of the adult female population and 11% of girls under 14). Women are also twice as affected as men by the HIV epidemic in Ivory Coast and the majority of new infections are among young girls.

However, knowledge of HIV prevention remains low, particularly among young people: only 20% of them have a real understanding of it and their use of condoms is still limited. The stakes are high considering that Ivory Coast is one of the countries most affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic in West Africa, with a prevalence rate of 2.4%. In this context, the project makes it possible to capitalise on the partnership established with the association Espace Confiance to reach key populations, and to broaden Solthis' action beyond the fight against HIV/AIDS to the wider issue of SRHR by integrating a differentiated approach.

OBJECTIVES

Empowerment and access to quality SRHR services and interventions adapted to the needs of adolescents and young people (A&Y), particularly those in vulnerable situations

Act on 3 action levers through a multi-channel approach:

- On demand: information and empowerment of A&Y, especially vulnerable A&J in Ivory Coast.
- supply: strengthening health structures to adapt their SRH services to A&Y, particularly those in vulnerable situations (public primary care centres and community centres).
- the enabling environment: communities, national authorities, civil society organisations...

EXPECTED RESULTS

- The empowerment of A&Y, especially those in vulnerable situations, is strengthened
- Strengthening the DSSR service offer for quality care, adapted to the specific needs of A&Y
- The national environment is more favourable to A&Y DSSRs



MAIN ACTIVITIES

- Participatory community diagnosis of A&Y
- Strengthening the knowledge and skills of A&Y on SRHR and the availability of services
- Mobilisation of ambassadors to promote SRHR among young people and their entourage
- Participatory diagnosis of SRHR and GBV (gender-based violence) service provision for A&Y in vulnerable situations
- Capacity building for health providers on the global approach to SRHR (including GBV), the service package, the specificities of A&Y in vulnerable situations, notably on self-care (self-administration of contraceptives, self-testing for HIV, STIs and pregnancy, etc.), for A&Y who consult the services
- Support for the improvement, adaptation and equipment of health structures in line with the initial diagnosis of the SRH service offer
- Development and improvement of the quality of the SRH service offer by strengthening the skills of community health workers and peer educators and strengthening existing advanced strategies adapted and accessible to A&Y, particularly those in vulnerable situations
- Contribute to the national frameworks for advocacy on SRHR
- Making available and disseminating the results and outputs of the project at national and international levels
